

# Irish / Language Exemption

• For NUI (which cover UCC, UG, UCD, RCSI, NUIM etc)

A student who has a language exemption and wishes to apply to a college of NUI must download details from <a href="https://www.nui.ie">www.nui.ie</a>
Students complete NUI exemption form **online and upload** with a copy of the Dept. Ed. Exemption certificate (got from school)

#### For UL

A student who has an exemption from Irish and wishes to apply to UL www.ul.ie must complete an online exemption form and upload a copy of the Dept. Ed. Exemption certificate (got from school)

(NOTE: same process for applying to DCU & Trinity College Dublin)

- This is very important as failure to do this will result in not receiving an offer as all entry requirements will not be met
- CAO strongly recommend to apply for language exemptions after a CAO application has been made.

# If all Entry Requirements are met $\rightarrow$ applicant is deemed 'Qualified' to apply.

Remember.....

Entry Requirements <u>must</u> be satisfied before "points" are considered.

# **Published Points**

- All courses in HEI's (all Universities including TU's) publish points for their courses
- The points published are the points obtained to secure the last seat on that course
- If <u>two or more students</u> have the same points for the last seat for their nominated course, the CAO use a system called <u>Random selection</u> to decide which student receives a seat on that course.

#### **POINTS SYSTEM**

- Points are calculated from ONE sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- Points total is calculated from SIX best subjects
- OBonus points are awarded for Honours Math (Maximum points now 625)
- ONOTE: Entry Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the Leaving Certificate

#### RESTRICTED ENTRY COURSES

- Some courses have Interviews/ Aptitude tests/Portfolio/Auditions
- Medicine HPAT test on late February
- apply by Mid-January
- Check CAO handbook
- Must apply by February 1st for all restricted entry courses. (clearly marked in handbook)



#### Making an Application



- •Applications can be **made online** (or by paper form).
- •Always keep proof of sending application.
- •Fill out both course lists (Level 8 + Level 6/7)
- •<u>In genuine order of Preference</u>not based on Predictions of next year's grades.

So – what is the best way to fill in the courses?



#### **After Making Application**

- Receive CAO number and Statement of Course Choices check this carefully.
- Some students may be called for extra assessments.
- Receive Statement of Application Record check details carefully.
- Change of Mind facility becomes available use sparingly and carefully.
- Leaving Cert. Results are sent to CAO.
- Places are allocated and offered by post and online
- Students accept, reject or defer offered places.
- Further rounds of offers are made until all course places are filled.

# Statement of Application Record.

- Check the following carefully, if there is any error or omission, amend the Statement and return it to CAO.
- Are all the courses shown and in the correct order?
- Are all the codes correct?
- Are the exam numbers correct?
- Are all exams mentioned?
- If you do not receive a Statement by 1st June contact CAO immediately.

# **Change of Mind**

After 5th May To 1st July you can register a change of courses

# Traditionally, Leaving Certificate results and CAO offers are....

- Leaving Certificate results will be issued in mid August...
- CAO round 1 offers will be issued the following Monday after LC results are announced
- Round 1 acceptance deadline
- Round 2 begins after round 1 acceptance deadline



# **Offer of Places**

• 2 offers may be received:

One from Level 8 list and One from Level 6/7 list.

#### **ONLY ONE OFFER MAY BE ACCEPTED**

 When you are offered one of your course preferences on a list, automatically you will be excluded for consideration from all courses below that OFFER

 This is why it is so important to fill in form in your Genuine Order of Preference

## The Offer Process

- There can be no delays at the offer/acceptance stage.
- Any offer not accepted by the closing date for receipt of acceptance of offers in CAO will be offered to another applicant in the next round of offers.

- The importance of you, the applicant, of placing courses in genuine order of preference will become apparent in the following demonstration.

   Always check (College & Course) entry requirements
- Jim rearranged his original list (completed as a genuine order of choice) ... but due to panic and/or listening to his friends adjusted his list and again lost out to courses he originally preferred
- Every course below what Jim (you) got offered is deleted
- Please be careful and arrange your list according to your own genuine order of preference
- + be mindful of entry requirements for college/courses

# Deferral

- Deferring means that you do not want to take your place this year but will do so next year
- Some courses cannot be deferred, you are recommended to check with the college in advance about their deferral terms and conditions and arrangements.
- What to Do if Deferring
- (a) Once the offer is given do not accept it
- (b) Contact the Higher Education Institution (HEI)Admissions Office immediately. They will let you know if the offer will be deferred.
- <u>If NOT</u> allowed..... you have option to accept but the whole process must be complete before deadline for acceptance
- Refer to CAO Handbook Deferring a place pg28

# Accepting a deferred course the following year

- Reapply to the CAO the following year with only that deferred course as your only choice
- You will then get offered that course in round zero
- If you put any other courses on the form you will forfeit your deferred course offer
- You will then have to compete for places with all other applicants





- All student applications will be made online to SUSI (Student Universal Support Ireland) through their website: www.susi.ie
- Application dates will be announced by the Department of Education and Skills – normally April – July – apply early
- Based on the previous year financial documentation 2023
- If you intend to apply to SUSI for a grant, you may indicate this on your CAO online application. CAO will then provide your identification, contact and offer/acceptance details to the grant authority (SUSI)
- Ticking this section of the CAO form does not mean that you have applied to SUSI so make sure to visit <a href="www.studentfinance.ie">www.studentfinance.ie</a> or <a href="www.susi">www.susi</a> to complete the necessary steps. Other than providing these details to the grant authority, CAO plays no role in processing grant applications

# **SUSI**

- SUSI grant comes in two separate parts: -
- A full SUSI grant will pay for student contribution fee worth €3000 (traditionally....)
- 2. Living expenses referred to as Maintenance Grant Has two rates ...
  - adjacent rate (living < 30km from college) or non-adjacent rates.
  - Also different levels of grant awards full and partial

# **SUSI**

- Must meet the following 5 criteria:-
- Enrolled in an approved fulltime course ie. PLC (no fee support), HEIs, European colleges. In general private colleges are not eligible for SUSI. Check with each private college
- 2. Lived 3 out of the last 5 years in Ireland, the EU, the EEA or Switzerland
- Income level threshold increased in Budget 2023 total household income combined with the number of dependents (those in full time education and living at home)
- 4. Progression through education if repeat a year grant stops for that year
- 5. A major award i.e., level 5,6,7 or 8

# SUSI application

- Go to www.susi.ie, click log in
- Click 'register your account' PPS number and email address is required
- Create username and password and click submit. You can now log in to make your application
- 6 sections:-
- A. Personal details
- B. Nationality & Residency
- C. The Course you are applying to and academic history
- D. Personal Details parent(s)/legal guardians
- E. Dependent children
- F. Reckonable Income

Eligibility reckoner – quick and easy way to check if eligible for funding

# Scholarships/Bursuries

- Variety of scholarships/bursaries exist -over 300 in Ireland wide set of criteria for eligibility - Extra benefits - free gym, free or subsidised accommodation guaranteed, decreased CAO points, etc
  - Sports scholarships
  - Academic/Entrance scholarships
  - Performing Arts
  - Leadership or outstanding in any area of your life
  - UCD Ad Astra, UCC Quercus, UL (bronze, silver, gold)
  - Scholarships/Bursaries funded by the Department of Education and Skills All Ireland Scholarship (125 in total worth €6750 each per year no application required automatic based on certain criteria exempt from LC fee (medical card)and points achieved in LC), 1916 Bursary Fund (200 awards worth €5000 per year apply through college/university and must be economically disadvantaged)
- Student Assistance Fund provides financial assistance for full time higher education students who are experiencing financial difficulties whilst attending college
- Fund for students with disabilities allocates funding to further and higher education colleges for the provision of services and supports for full time students with disabilities
- Area based Grants/Scholarships Credit Union Member Bursaries/Scholarships
- Check individual college websites for details, i.e. criteria, application forms and closing dates for application.

# Dare Continued

- If you wish to disclose a disability or learning difficulty, click on the 'Modify Disability....Status' button on the online CAO form and follow the instructions provided.
- You must disclose your disability/learning difficulty no later than 1st
   March at 5pm by which you must fully and correctly complete Section A
   of the Supplementary Information Form(SIF) this is part of the CAO
   application.
- If you wish to be considered for DARE you must answer "yes" to question 1 on Section A of the fully completed SIF by 5pm on 1st March 2023.
- Download Section B of the SIF (Educational Impact Statement) which will be completed with the support from the school. – students must contact the guidance department asap if considering applying for DARE – work in conjunction with the SEN department. Section B along with Section C of the DARE application must be returned to CAO to arrive no later than 5pm on 15th March 2023 – applicant's responsibility – proof of postage – keep copies.

- Dare Continued:
- Section C Evidence of Disability to be completed by the appropriate medical professional (only if you do not have a report verifying your disability).
- In place of Section C applicants presenting with Specific Learning Disabilities are asked to provide a full psychological assessment report completed by an appropriate qualified psychologist.
- If the applicant does not have a full psychological assessment report, they may request the school (Section D School statement) to complete this statement and the applicant must return to CAO to arrive by 5pm on March 15th.

- HEAR Higher Education Access Route Not the SUSI grant
- For students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
- 20 Colleges taking part.
- Quota of places offered on a reduced points basis.
- Post entry supports financial, academic, social, personal.
- Must meet matriculation/minimum entry requirements.
- Must satisfy 3 of the 6 financial indicators must meet indicator 1 HEAR income limit plus right combination of 2 other indicators to be eligible.
- Must apply online to CAO by 5pm on 1st Feb 2023
- No later than 5pm on 1st March on CAO application that you wish to apply for HEAR and fully and correctly complete all elements of the HEAR form which is part of the CAO application. Once completed a checklist will appear indicating what documents to submit.
- Supporting Documentation required based on 2021 financial year refer to CAO handbook p.99 post to arrive in CAO no later than 5pm on March 15th submit copies keep originals proof of postage.

- Applicants who are both DARE and HEAR eligible will be PRIORITISED by colleges when allocating reduced points places.



- Can begin with a PLC (Level 5) and end up with a Doctorate (Level 10).
- •All QQI Level 5 and QQI Level 6 awards will be scored to deliver a maximum of 390 CAO points. Further information may be obtained from the QQI website https://www.qqi.ie/

### **POST LEAVING CERTIFICATE COURSES (PLCS)**

- Courses in very high demand in recent years.
- Contact each college to see when they will start accepting your application from.
- Most PLC courses expect to fill all places in March interviews.
- Requirements usually 5 passes in your Leaving Certificate. Please consult prospectus for 2024 entry.






# 3RD ALTERNATIVE ROUTE: NEW TERTIARY DEGREE PROGRAMMES

- A tertiary course is one that commences in an Education and Training Board (ETB / Further Education Colleges) and continues in a Higher Education Institution (HEI / Technical Universities), culminating in the award of a degree.
- There are 23 tertiary degree courses which were due to start in September 2023 across 11 locations and 5 fields of provision including Business, ICT, Arts, Engineering, Manufacturing & Construction and Health & Welfare.

- Cork / Kerry area ..... (Business) (Software Dev) (Animation) (Music)
- Galway / Roscommon.... (Nursing) (Lab Science) (Eng Tech) (Business)
- Students must apply directly to the individual colleges. You do not apply for a Tertiary education programme through the CAO. You can find out about applying on the National Tertiary Office (NTO) website.



- •More importantly the student is motivated to study to achieve their goals and has a study plan which works for them.


